I am an author who had been an actor until the early 1960's. Marilyn Monroe was a friend, our sporadic acquaintanceship spanned the years from 1953 (when I first met Marilyn) until 1960 when we were to have starred in a film together, *THE STRIPPER*, at 20th Century Fox studios. I have authored a book of memoirs about Marilyn, *INSIDE MARILYN MONROE*, published in 2007, based on my relationship with her. I have been a keynote speaker at a number of Memorials for Marilyn, and met her at a fan-based get-together celebrating Marilyn's birthday. Over the years I have encountered a number of Marilyn impersonators, and was never overly impressed. I found there was something usually missing in the individuals (apart from the blonde wigs and 'Marilyn-like' dresses). What I found lacking was a sort of internal energy—something radiating from the individual apart from the surface glamor. She possessed this energy. It was as though once again, after all the years, I was experiencing Marilyn. It is a feeling that far transcends the surface energy and mannerisms presented by others attempting to portray Marilyn. She and I posed for a photographer present at the party, and he asked that we kiss. It was a strange moment—for those few seconds, it was as though at least 47 years dissolved.

The Hollywood Blonde

Having performed over 2,000 times as an International Celebrity Lookalike, Holly is a true professional. She's approved by Marilyn's Estate, and won the Hollywood Entertainment Contest, Ringling Brothers, and the Lookalike Industry's "Reel Award". She's been featured in the book "Marilyns Are A Guy's Best Friend" and in the upcoming photo documentary "Meet the Stars of the Stars". Her work has inspired 3 recorded songs, and she recorded "Fever" with Grammy-winning talent on the CD "Swingin' South". For several years she was the star Marilyn at Universal Studios for press events. Her "Diamonds" dress was on display in a Marilyn exhibit, and she taught the makeup artist for Universal Studios Japan her tricks.

From Corporate Events and Private Parties to film and TV sets, she is one of the most in-demand look-alikes in Hollywood. With over 80 film and TV appearances as a look-alike, you may have seen her in Dickie Roberts, History's Mysteries, the TV Guide Channel, or Entertainment Tonight and has been the subject of numerous reality TV pitches. A live singer/dancer, she performs at corporate and press events and casinos internationally.

She is a true entertainer: relatable, improvisational, and always looking for the fun. As Marilyn, she has her slightly off-kilter wit and brings more than just the trademark characteristics, described as "natural" and "having her heart", she touches people with the illusion. The real magic happens when you look her in the eyes.

At 13, a film role was written for her as a "Marilyn type" before she even knew who Marilyn was. At the premiere, songwriter and friend of Marilyn, Bernie Wayne, wanted to introduce her to Las Vegas as the newest Marilyn Monroe. On her 16th birthday, she accepted an award for Best Supporting Actress. She became entrenched in the community theatre scene, and as a high school senior won a city-wide acting competition performing Bus Stop followed by first place in the Regional National Society of Arts and Letters. She's performed in about every form of legitimate "talent" work there is. Through her leading role in George Axelrod's "Goodbye Charlie" (playwrite of "The Seven Year Itch"), she landed her first Marilyn job at The President Casino. One phone call to Chicago resulted in being booked two days later as Marilyn for Comic Relief as well as immediate full-time work at the Hollywood Casino where she mastered the art of "Meet & Greet" in character. Now she's at home in Hollywood, ironically with the same view as Marilyn had from her orphanage window!

Melding together art and craft, she brings a unique focus on historical re-creation to her characters. A seamstress since she could hold a needle, she works from her well-equipped sewing and craft room to fashion her own costumes and wigs- each an historically accurate replica complete with matching hair and jewelry. She studies the iconic photographs and has been lucky enough to know the collectors and see the costumes up close. In her professional level make-up and styling room, she sculpts her face to complete the transformation. When this work is combined with her actor's dedication to staying in character and natural joie de vivre, even the most scrutinizing are always pleased.

She performs a masterful "Happy Birthday" show, typically with several songs and improvisational comedy, and up to an hour long stage show.
